

For the Associate School Library Media Specialist certification, you must hold a standard New Jersey instructional certificate or complete a year-long school-based residency program in a school library media center under a provisional certificate and college-level study in educational theory, curriculum design and integration, teaching methodology, student/learning development, and behavior management before a standard certificate can be issued. A certified school administrator, principal or supervisor shall provide supervision during your provisional year.
