



Labor Studies and Employment Relations B.A.

(Offered by Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey)

Admission Requirements:

Completion of an AA or AS degree. Admission to Rutgers University programs is competitive. The credentials of all applicants are evaluated on an individual basis to determine eligibility for admission to Rutgers University.

How to Apply:

Applications may be completed online at www.admissions.rutgers.edu. Applicants should be sure to choose *Labor Studies at Western Monmouth* as the school choice in Question 17 of the online application. Completed application materials must be submitted before admission can be granted to Rutgers University. This includes: application, application fee, official high school transcript/or/proof of GED, and all previous college transcripts. Applicants to the program must also have completed, or be in the process of completing, an Associate's Degree. In some circumstances, applicants who have completed 60 or more credits but do not have an Associate Degree, may also be considered for admission. Such applicants must meet with the Manager of Academic Programs prior to completing an application. There is a \$60 application fee.

Application Deadlines:

Priority deadlines of January 15 for Fall admission and October 15 for Spring. Applications will be accepted after these dates on a space available.

Part-Time/Full-Time:

Students may be part-time or full-time.

Location:

Rutgers University courses are offered at the Western Monmouth Higher Education Center in Freehold.

Tuition:

Part-time: \$304.00/credit plus semester fees

Full-time \$4,773.00 plus semester fees (09-10 tuition rate)

Please note: these tuition rates are subject to change.

Transfer Credit:

A maximum of 60 credits may be accepted for transfer credit with a completed AA or AS degree.

Degree FAQ:

How many credits are required?

120 credits are required for the BA in Labor Studies and Employment Relations.

Can I attend courses at the home campus as well?

Students may only take courses at the Western Monmouth Higher Education Center in Freehold

Once enrolled in this degree, can I take any additional Brookdale classes to count towards this degree?

This will be determined on a case by case basis in consultation with a Rutgers academic advisor. Enrolled students should not take any courses at Brookdale without the explicit permission of Rutgers University.

What can I expect upon applying to Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey?

Admission Letter:

Depending on the time of year that you apply, you will receive a reply to your admission application approx. 3-4 weeks after submitting complete application materials.

Transfer Evaluation:

An official evaluation of your transfer credit will not be done until you accept your offer of admission to Rutgers University and have paid the \$125.00 "acceptance fee". Labor Studies can expect to wait from 2-6 weeks before receiving an official transfer evaluation from the School of Arts & Sciences University in New Brunswick. The new student should work with the Rutgers representative in Freehold, who is also an academic advisor for the Labor Studies program, to construct a reasonably accurate unofficial evaluation.

Registration Information:

Labor Studies: Once a student has met with the academic advisor in Freehold, he/she can then register. New students must register in person with the Manager of Academic Programs. Students may register online in subsequent semesters.

Financial Aid Offices
