General Education Courses

Students must earn a B- or higher (exceptions made with dept. approval) to meet partial program entry requirements in the following courses: **ENG 1030, MATH 1000, COMM 1402, BIO 1000, HIST 2303 or 2304, and EMSE 2800.**

Students must also earn a C or higher in the following additional courses after acceptance into the program and before Pre-Professional Internship (EMSE 3802): **HIST 2304, MATH 1010, and a science course (options include CHEM 1010, ASTR 1100, GEOL 1200, ES 1400, and PHYS 1000 or 1400).** Other college level science courses are acceptable as well.

Academic Major

Students majoring in Elementary Education are required to take an academic major in liberal arts, mathematics, or science as outlined in the Kean University catalog. Some overlap with General Education may occur, in which case the courses that overlap must also be a C grade or higher. Some majors require a greater number of credits and additional cognates. Check specific departmental grade requirements.

Note: Students may choose to use general education courses to satisfy major requirements. For example history majors may wish to use the US History courses to satisfy major requirements and if so they must choose additional liberal art courses, to satisfy the credit requirement for General Education. Students should consult their academic advisor to determine appropriate course substitutions. This situation may occur with other second majors and the students should consult with their academic advisor regarding appropriate course substitution.

Professional Education Courses

Students entering Kean University as freshmen or transfers must earn a B- or higher in all Professional Education courses and a Satisfactory grade in **EMSE 3800 and EMSE 4800. EDUC 3000 and EDUC 3400 or 3403** must be completed prior to taking. **EMSE 3800; EMSE 4440 & 4441** must be completed prior to EMSE 4800 and 4900.

EMSE 4900 Senior Seminar and **EMSE 4800** Professional Internship *must* be taken together and no other course registration is permitted.

Oral and Written Competency in Languages of Instruction

Students entering the Bilingual Option must also demonstrate oral and written competency in both languages of instruction, for example, Spanish and English, as measured by the **ACTFL Proficiency Assessment**. Registration and administration of this test is done in the Elementary Ed. & Bilingual Ed. Department located in Willis 105 B The passing scores for Bilingual Education candidates are:

This test must be completed before being declared a bilingual option major.

Writing Emphasis Requirement: All students are required to complete one “Writing Emphasis (WE) course. The WE course should be within the major program. **EMSE 4440** satisfies this requirement for your Professional Major. However, you should consult your content major program advisor (i.e. History, Earth Science, etc.) for any requirements in the respective program.

PRAXIS I: All students entering the Elementary Education Program are required to take the **PRAXIS I**. This is a test in preparation for the Praxis II. Students must earn a score of **172** on the **PRAXIS I** to become eligible to apply to the Elementary Education program.

Praxis II (formerly the National Teachers Exam): The State of New Jersey requires a passing score (141) on the Elementary Education: Content Area (10014) of the Praxis II exam prior to senior field experience.
