

Brookdale Community College and Seton Hall University

Transfer Agreement (Effective July 1, 2011)

Seton Hall and Brookdale Community College agree to the following:

1. Admission and Enrollment Guidelines. All Brookdale Community College **Associates of Arts (A.A.) or Associates of Science (A.S.) degree graduates** interested in transferring to Seton Hall must complete Seton Hall's Transfer Student Admissions Application and timely provide all required attendant documentation.
 - a. Seton Hall/Brookdale Community College. A.A. and A.S. degree program-graduates of Brookdale Community College, transferring under the terms of this agreement, will have their **application fee waived**.
 - b. General Admissions (Appendix A). Seton Hall will accept students who have maintained a **cumulative GPA of above 2.5 or higher** (on a 4.0 scale) at Brookdale Community College as outlined by major in Appendix A. Seton Hall will **accept up to 70 transfer credits with a grade of at least a C**.
 - c. CORE Waiver. Seton Hall will waive its University CORE requirements (except Signature III taken in Junior or Senior year) for students with an Associates of Arts or Associates of Science degree. **For students entering into the College of Arts and Sciences, their College core will be waived except for 6 credits of Philosophy and Religion**. Please see Appendix B for transferable Philosophy courses from Brookdale Community College and Appendix C for Program to Program alignment. Seton Hall will accept major courses as outlined on the NJ Transfer Recommended Transfer Program and course equivalency database.

2. Transfer Scholarships.
 - a. General Scholarships. Brookdale Community College students will be eligible for all scholarships available to transfer students.
 - b. Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Seton Hall will award student members of Phi Theta Kappa a \$2,000 scholarship in addition to any other scholarship for which the student otherwise qualifies.

I. Admission Requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.

Certain Majors require a higher GPA for transfer students as follows:

College of Arts and Sciences/Biology	2.8 GPA and student must have taken a Biology, Chemistry and Pre Calc with a C or better if not they will be placed in PSCI
College of Arts and Sciences /Physical Therapy, Physician Assistant, Athletic Training and Occupational Therapy	Not accepted directly into these majors but to Biology if applicable. Occupational Therapy may choose to major in Biology or Social and Behavioral Sciences if applicable.
