Passion and Persuasion: The Literary and Political legacy of the Ancient Greeks

6 days in Athens with guided tours of main attractions (1 full free day for possible optional trip to Crete)

The intellectual and artistic achievements of the Greeks continue to matter to us, as much of our lives, outlooks, and tastes have been shaped by Greek culture. Examine our literary connection to Ancient Greece, in Athens—where



religion fed drama and became literature, as we know it. Experience early World Literature (ENGL 235) through your senses, as you walk through the setting of assigned texts. Earn credit for Writing and Research (ENG 122) in the city where the first democratic revolution occurred. Invoke the Athenian spirit as you examine the art of persuasion in its many incarnations in contemporary American culture. Students may take both courses for six credits, or select one course for three credits.
