2014 MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for students presently attending a New Jersey community/county college who are pursuing a major in a science, technology, engineering or math (“STEM”) field, have at least a 3.5 G.P.A., are in financial need and have completed 12 credits, but have at least 21 credits left to complete **their community college degrees**. Last year, 16 scholars were selected for this award. Scholars were awarded either \$1,500 or \$750 scholarships.

In addition to submitting the attached scholarship application completed, the applicant must also submit the following: **Resume; Certified College Transcript; and Optional: Letter of Reference.**

If you have previously been selected for this scholarship, you are not eligible to reapply. You do not have to be a U.S. citizen to apply for this scholarship. If you are selected as a scholarship candidate, you will be interviewed by the Council Scholarship Committee in April/May on a date to be determined. Additionally, if you are chosen as a scholarship recipient, you will be required to attend the Merit Scholar Luncheon in the summer of 2014 as well as the Council’s Annual Patent Awards Dinner in November 2014.
