Christopher Bellitto, PhD and Brooks Susman, rabbi emeritus

How have Jews and Christians viewed each other through scripture and the arts over time?

Join us as we explore a shared heritage – first of conflict and recently of reconciliation – by considering Jewish and Christian history,

art, and scriptural interpretation through the centuries. Rabbi Susman and Dr. Bellitto have lectured together for two decades, offering talks on what is shared and distinct in Christmas and Chanukah, Passover and Easter, scripture and traditions. Their goal is to bridge the presumptive polarizing gap between Judaism and Christianity by using an open-eyed view of history to promote understanding and good faith moving forward.

Impacts Of The Revolutionary War In Monmouth County Rick Geffken, MA

Join Rick for an in-depth examination of the Revolutionary War in Monmouth County, the people on both sides, Tories and Rebels; battles and skirmishes; religions; the economy and more. We'll highlight the conflicts between Militia Captain Joshua Huddy and the British Loyalist and a runaway slave Colonel Tye. Discover the role religious organizations played

during the Revolution: Dutch Church leader Dominie Benjamin DuBois; Church of England's Rev. Samuel Cooke; Presbyterian Tennent Church's Rev. John Tennent Woodhull; and Quakers such as the Grover and Hartshorne families. Embark on virtual visits to the many 1776-1782 Revolutionary war sites in Monmouth County. Besides the famous Battle of Monmouth Court House in 1778, many other skirmishes, raids, murders, and incidents happened during what has been called the Civil War in Monmouth County. We'll look at the places where these events happened comparing how they looked then and now.

In The Time Of The Tudors: The Pole Family Lyndell O'Hara, PhD

Margaret Pole, Countess of Salisbury, was the niece of the last two Plantagenet kings of England and elder sister of the "Princes in the Tower." She held a stronger claim to the English throne than the Tudors, yet she served with loyalty in the courts of both Henry VII and Henry VIII. As Henry VIII's marriage to Katherine unraveled, the allegiance of the Pole family came under suspicion and Lady Margaret, with her sons Reginald,

Geoffrey and Henry, attempted to ride out the rising storm of Henry VIII's wrath.



Checks and Balances: The Durability Of A Constitutional Principle Bruce Brickman, Esq.

The U.S. Constitution's design hinges on two fundamental ideas: the separation of powers and the system of checks and balances that gives it life. Explore how that operational core of governance continues to function amid shifting political dynamics and institutional change. Examine the evolving role of Congress, the expanding scope of presidential power, and

the legal and constitutional implications of executive orders and judicial review. Historical context and precedent will guide our exploration of recent Supreme Court decisions on immigration, federal civil service, and the authority of independent agencies. Participants are encouraged to bring their insights and questions to what promises to be a timely, thoughtful, and engaging dialogue on the resilience of one of our nation's most essential principles.







The American Civil War


Gregory Caggiano, presenter, author, blogger

Christopher M. Bellitto, Ph.D., is Professor of History at Kean University, where he teaches courses in ancient and medieval history. A specialist in the Middle Ages, church history and reform, he is the author of ten books and over 30 articles and book chapters published in the United States and Europe. He has twice won grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities. In Summer 2019, he was a Fulbright Specialist at the University of Canterbury in Christchurch, New Zealand, and was Visiting Scholar at Princeton Theological Seminary 2021-2022. Dr. Bellitto also serves as series Editor in Chief of Brill's Companions to the Christian Tradition and Academic Editor at Large for Paulist Press. A media commentator on church history and contemporary Catholicism, he appears frequently in print, on radio, and television.

From Hathern To Highlands: The Hartshornes Of Monmouth County Rick Geffken, MA

Review the lives of Hugh and Richard Hartshorne of Hathern, Leicestershire, England, early investors in the Jerseys. Older brother Hugh, described as "an upholsterer," was actually a well-connected businessman in the Worshipful Company of Skinners in London and also one of the original 24 East Jersey Proprietors, although he never visited New Jersey. Richard showed up in Monmouth County in 1669 and purchased huge tracts of land, including today's Sandy Hook and Hartshorne's Woods. Art Detectives: The Metropolitan Museum Of Art Rachael Goldman, PhD, historian

In recent years, the collecting practices of long-established encyclopedic museums have undergone re-examination. Fine Art and archaeological pieces of historical relevance have recently been considered within the context of their provenance and heritage. Museums now have an even larger watchdog role on the global stage, with responsibilities to document the acquisition process. The Met has embarked on an ambitious project of transparent research and repatriation. Objects from Ancient Egypt, Greece and Rome, from Turkey and the Ancient Near East, and Ancient India as well as ten works that were appropriated during the Nazi occupation of Europe have been part of the repatriation effort. Nineteen objects originally from the Tomb of King Tutankhamun round out this mission. For all the Met's efforts more work must be done. We will discuss the importance of the wide-reaching attitudes to museum collecting and the encyclopedic museum.


Dr. Rachael Goldman holds a Ph.D. from the City University of New York-Graduate Center in History. She is the author of "Color-Terms in a Social and Cultural Context in Ancient Rome" published by Gorgias Press. She has studied at the Summer Classical School at the American Academy in Rome and won awards from the New York Classical School. She has been published in the journal Glotta, the Bryn Mawr Classical Review, the Classical Journal, the Renaissance Quarterly and the Decorative Arts Journal of the Bard Graduate Center. She has taught at Adelphi University, the College of New Jersey, Rutgers College, and at various schools in City University of New York. She completed the Sotheby's American Fine and Decorative Arts course, and began her career as an appraiser, cataloguing the Asia and Jacobo Furman Judaica Collection. As a specialist for Bonhams, she ushered in the first Judaica sale. Rachael is a certified member of the Appraisers Association of America.


