

Important Information about your Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG). Your anticipated CCOG award will be adjusted and finalized after the add/drop period is over for each term you are registered.

- You must be registered and attending at least 6 credits to qualify for CCOG.
- You may view your anticipated CCOG award in your Self Service under Student Finance. **You must click on Account Activity for the term in question.**
- Your CCOG is applied to your allowable tuition and educational fees (read more in next bullet) that were not paid for by other federal, state, or institutional grants and/or scholarships. CCOG is a last dollar award and therefore will never exceed your total balance.
- Tuition and fees are covered up to a maximum amount based on an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) reported on your FAFSA, and number of registered credits/enrollment status.
 - **FAFSA Income with an AGI of \$0 - \$65,000** may receive a term award of up to \$4,475 as a full-time student (at least 12 credits), up to \$3,356 as a three-quarter time student (9 – 11 credits), and \$2237 as a half-time student (6 – 8 credits).
 - **FAFSA Income with an AGI of \$65,001 - \$80,000** may receive a term award of up to \$2,238 as a full-time student (at least 12 credits), up to \$1,678 as a three-quarter time student (9 – 11 credits), and \$1119 as a half-time student (6 – 8 credits).
 - **FAFSA Income with an AGI of \$80,001 - \$100,000** may receive a term award of up to \$1,491 as a full-time student (at least 12 credits), up to \$1118 as a three-quarter time student (9 – 11 credits), and \$745 as a half-time student (6 – 8 credits).
- The maximum number of CCOG payments you can receive at a Community College is the equivalent of 5 full time terms.
- CCOG can only cover approved fees and up to the cost of in county tuition. **If you are an out of county student, your bill may not be covered in full, and you may owe a balance.** Award amounts will be manually adjusted and finalized to exact allowable amounts prior to transmission.
