It culminates with the incredible wax fabrics sold by African merchants on Petticoat Lane today.

Dover Street Market - Bringing together the who's who in fashion, Rei Kawakubo's groundbreaking fashion-meets-art gallery concept store is a must-visit destination for fashion lovers. Head downstairs for the most affordable curation of products, dwell on the middle floors for sartorial inspiration and investment pieces.
