Ο Students have a number of options to satisfy this requirement; courses will be evaluated on an individual basis.

For transfer credit Brookdale students must have a "C" or higher in all courses.

Criminal Justice students must take 7, 300 + level courses for the Major. Please note the requirements of 7 courses do not include any course that may transfer into Rider as a 300 level course.
