6:20-1.4 Certification for a State-Issued High School Diploma

- 2. Requests for the evaluation of college coursework shall be done in the form of a written request signed by the person making the request, and by submitting an official transcript from each academic institution from which coursework is to be evaluated. A person who qualifies will have 30 general education credits leading to a degree at an accredited institution of higher education. Persons meeting these requirements will receive a State-Issued High School Diploma and Diploma Verification Letter.
 - i. Included in the 30 general education credits must be a minimum of three credits in each:

English language arts; mathematics; science; social studies; and, six total credits in any of the following: visual and performing arts; comprehensive health and physical education; world language; technology and 21st century life and careers.

- ii. Remedial college courses shall not count toward the requirement.
- iii. The minimum average grade for the 30 credits shall be a C or 2.0.
- 3. Persons seeking to qualify for a state-issued high school diploma as outlined in this section shall be at least 16 years of age and out of school. Exceptions to the age requirement may be made by the Commissioner for persons under 16 years of age who have otherwise met all State high school graduation requirements. Such determination will be made on a case by case considering extraordinary academic or personal achievement.
