

For admission to Traditional Day Programs-

All transfer students take required credits in each area as designated in the day student core curriculum, however without the specification of which course they need to take in those areas. That is to say, a day transfer student with A.A./A.S. degree needs to take/should have taken the following to satisfy his/her general education requirement at SPU.

6 credits of literature,	6 credits of languages,	6 credits of history,
6 credits of social sciences	6 credits of math,	6 credits of philosophy,
6 credits of theology	3 credits of fine arts	3-6 credits of composition
6 credits of natural sciences		

Courses taken at another institution may be transferred in to fulfil the core requirement at SPU as long as they fit in the above mentioned areas and with the required number of credits. For a day transfer student without an A.A./A.S. degree but with 30 credits or above, the same policy will be followed. A day transfer student with less than 30 credits, will need to follow the SPU day core curriculum. All distributive requirements, including Values, Pluralism, and Writing Intensive, will be taken at Saint Peter's.

For admission to the School of Professional and Continuing Studies-

Specifically, for transfer students who possess an A.A. or A.S. degree from a New Jersey community college with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0, the community college general education program credits will be transferred in full to satisfy, as a block, the proposed general education requirements with the exception of 6 credits in Philosophy, 6 credits in Theology and the 3-credit Values course requirement. In other words, students must have taken or take 6 credits in Philosophy, Theology and a course designated a Values course. Only courses in which a grade of "C" or higher has been achieved will be eligible for transfer. Courses transferred as part of the community college's general education program that have Saint Peter's College general education equivalents will be transferred as those equivalent courses. Students will need a minimum of 48 credits of general education requirement and a minimum of 120 credits to graduate. Students will need to take their last 30 credits at Saint Peter's College and students must complete at least one half of their major credits and minor credits at Saint Peter's College. The maximum number of credits a student may transfer from a two-year college is 66 and 90 credits from a four-year institution. Upper division courses (numbered 300 and above) may not be taken at a two-year college.
