

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

Brookdale Community College, NJ, USA

1. The Agreement

This document is an agreement between Aberystwyth University (hereafter referred to as AU) and Brookdale Community College (hereafter referred to as BCC). On successful completion of the programmes listed in paragraph 4a of this agreement, students will be accepted to the second year of the AU degree programme listed in 4a. On successful completion of the two year study at AU, students will be awarded the appropriate AU Bachelor honours degree.

This agreement may be extended to other AU programmes by future agreements.

2. Date of Commencement and Duration of the Agreement

The agreement shall become effective at the date of signing by the representatives of both parties. This agreement will be subject to renewal three years from the date of signing.

3. Entry Requirements

- a) Based on the 2015-16 Brookdale Community College curriculum, students who successfully complete the programme listed in paragraph 4a in BCC, and achieve the grades that are noted in Appendix 2, will be recognised as having gained 120 credits at HE level 4. Such students will be accepted onto the second year of the named degree programmes listed in paragraph 4a in the relevant institute at AU. Students who successfully complete their study at AU will be awarded the appropriate AU degree.
- b) AU requires non-native speakers of English to obtain a minimum International English Language Testing Services (IELTS) score of:
 - 1. 6.0 (with no individual score lower than 5.5), or an equivalent English test as recognised by AU before they can progress to AU into the BSc Business and Management degree programme.
 - 2. 6.5 (with no individual score lower than 5.5), or an equivalent English test as recognised by AU before they can progress to AU into the Institute of Literature, Languages and the Creative Arts.
- c) Students who do not meet the minimum English requirement will be required to successfully complete an English Pre-sessional Course at Aberystwyth University prior to the academic year.
- d) Students are required to bring to Registration at Aberystwyth University a detailed and official transcript of their prior study at BCC.

4. Application and Admission

a) Students enrolled in the following BCC programme are eligible for application to transfer to AU to study towards an honours degree. Eligible transfer students who are accepted by AU will have the choice to enrol for the second year study in AU on the following programmes:

The annual intake to the programme from BCC is projected as 10 per annum. It is understood that the first intakes may be less than this. BCC cannot guarantee these numbers but will make this opportunity available to all students.

- b) An AU application form must be completed by the student in the manner required by AU at least 3 months prior to the expected date of transfer to AU. The AU academic year starts in September with a one week induction which is compulsory for all new students.
- c) Students wishing to enrol for programmes at AU other than the programmes listed in 4a) are welcome to apply. Such applications will be considered on an individual basis and not under this agreement.
- d) Representatives of AU may visit BCC to meet students and advise on application procedures and strategy.
- e) Once in AU, students shall register as full-time AU students. They will follow the same rules and regulations as all other AU students, and have the same rights and entitlements. Any breach of these rules and regulations will be considered in accordance with AU's written policies and procedures and on the same basis as all AU students.

- 5. Responsibilities of Brookdale Community College.
- a) BCC shall ensure that its portfolio of courses has all the necessary Government licences to operate and that any terms or conditions required are met in full.
- b) BCC students applying to AU shall provide the **Admissions Office** with a full transcript of their results as soon as their results are confirmed.
- c) Associated with this Articulation Agreement are copies of the following documents:
 - Course scheme/syllabus
 - Course grading structure
 - Course progression rules
- d) This Agreement is based on the current curriculum at BCC. Any changes (more than 25%) made by BCC shall be notified to AU in advance of implementation of the changes.
- e) All arrangements noted herewith are subject to a review during the period of this agreement if either BCC or AU considers it appropriate.
- 6. Responsibilities of Aberystwyth University
- a) AU will provide support to programme promotion and student transfer including visa application and accommodation booking. Please refer to the following International Office website for detailed information: http://www.aber.ac.uk/en/international/

7. Status of this Agreement

- a) This agreement shall be effective for three (3) years from the date of signing.
- b) Amendments to this Agreement may be made at any time by written correspondence, and only when agreed upon by both universities.
- c) Either university may terminate this agreement by giving the other party no less than 12 months advance written notice. In respect of any students who have enrolled on the AU Programme before the date of termination all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure that they are able to complete their course of study or embark upon an alternative programme. In such a situation, no student will be financially disadvantaged as a consequence of the termination.
- The two universities shall complete a review of the Agreement six (6) months prior to its expiration to decide whether to renew the agreement.

8. Advertising and Publicity Material

AU retains the right to approve and monitor any advertising or publicity material in which the arrangements with AU are mentioned. Copies of any such material should be submitted to the Director of the International Office of AU prior to publication. BCC has the same right on approving and monitoring any advertising or publicity materials in which the arrangements with BCC are mentioned. Copies of any such material should be submitted to BCC.

9. Discounts, Scholarships and Bursaries

Discounts, Scholarships and Bursaries are mapped out and agreed in Appendix 3 of this Agreement.

APPENDIX 1: FINANCE

- 1. Each student accepted by AU pay the standard overseas tuition fee to AU following the receipt of the formal offer. The fee payable by each student will be set at the beginning of their studies and would remain fixed for each year of their studies.
- 2. The tuition fee for new entrants to the Programme will be reviewed annually. AU tuition fees are published at www.aber.ac.uk/en/international/fees-money/. These fees will be subject to any arrangements that may be made under Appendix 3 of this Agreement.
- 3. Students who are attending the AU Pre-sessional English Course will be subject to an additional fee, which is payable following the receipt of the formal offer. - 5. Any amendments to the financial arrangements referred to in this annex shall be negotiated and agreed annually between AU and of BCC.
