TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE and BROOKDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This agreement between Brookdale Community College (BCC) and Bloomfield College connects students in the BCC Associate of Arts Degree in Education/Early Childhood Education Option to the Bachelor of Arts in Education at Bloomfield College. Connecting these degree programs will enable students to complete their associate degrees and then transfer seamlessly to Bloomfield College.

1. Subject to the following provisions, all students who complete the AA degree in Education/Early Childhood Education Option (ECE) at Brookdale Community College will be granted admission to Bloomfield College with junior standing upon proper application with General Education requirements considered completed.
2. Students applying for the B.A. in Education/Early Childhood and Elementary Education or Special Education with Early Childhood or Elementary Education (EDC) must
 - a. have a grade point average of 3.00 or higher on the scale of 4.0;
 - b. have junior standing (with 57 credits or more and final transcript documenting degree completion)
 - c. earned a C or better in Math and Writing courses and all Education courses
 - d. attained the minimum score set by the NJ Department of Education* on the PRAXIS Core Academic Skills Battery for Educators, SAT/ACT exam, or GRE**

***Students must attain the Basic Skills Requirements in effect for the semester they will be starting classes at Bloomfield College.**

****Students may be admitted for transfer to Bloomfield College without meeting this requirement, but they will not be admitted to the B.A. in Education program.**

3. Students may not receive credit for:
 - ◆ Courses with a grade below a C
 - ◆ Mathematics courses not equivalent to courses offered for General Education credit at Bloomfield College (MTH 130, MTH 140/141, MTH 160/161)
 - ◆ Credit earned by exam
 - ◆ Internship credit
 - ◆ Portfolio Learning Assessment credit
 - ◆ Other courses not offered for degree credit at Bloomfield College
4. Students must fulfill the same requirements for the BA in Education as specified in the Bloomfield College regulations at the time of their admission.
5. Credit toward the Bloomfield College elective requirements will be determined by the listing of course equivalencies in NJ Transfer (see attachment).
6. In accordance with NJ Administrative Code 9A, six (6) credits in Education may be accepted in transfer to an education program. Credit toward the major requirements for the B.A. in Education at Bloomfield

College will be given for any two (2) of the following Brookdale Community College courses, depending upon their intended focus:

- ◆ EDEC 105 Foundations of Early Childhood Education
- ◆ EDUC 217 Introduction to the Exceptional Child
- ◆ EDUC 225 Literacy Development and Instruction

In addition,

- ◆ EDEC 199 Early Childhood Education Field Experience will count toward the 50 clinical experience hours required by the NJ Department of Education leading up to the one semester of full-time clinical practice.
- ◆ PSYC 218 Educational Psychology will satisfy the PSY 210 Educational Psychology requirement for the B.A. in Education *and*

7. Co-Concentrations

Students transferring into the B.A. in Education will have to complete the requirements for a co-concentration (commonly known as a co-major) in addition to the Education major. Depending upon the co-concentration selected, students will have 8-11 course units to complete in addition to the Education major. The table below lists the possible co-concentrations and course equivalencies.

8. Students must complete a minimum of 8 course units/32 credits at Bloomfield College to meet the Bloomfield College residency requirements.
9. Any modifications to the curriculum or course equivalencies are subject to approval of the chief academic officers of both Brookdale Community County College and Bloomfield College.
10. Each institution will inform the other in a timely manner of proposed and affected modifications of programs covered in this agreement.
11. This Agreement will remain in effect from September 1, 2016 through August 30, 2021 or until modification by mutual consent or termination with one-year written notice by either party.
